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Introduction and Problem Statement

Title: The Crisis in Context: Deep-Seated Tensions

Content:

- Cameroon faces recurrent post-electoral disputes, most recently following the controversial October 12, 2025 presidential elections
- Deadly protests, opposition challenges, and a government crackdown highlight a perilous moment for national stability.
- The crisis is a symptom of long-standing governance failures, not just electoral issues.

GOAL:

• To present a Theory of Change (ToC) framework for moving from conflict to sustainable political stability in Cameroon.

Understanding the Root Causes (The "Problem Tree")

Title: Root Causes of the Crisis

Content:

• Authoritarian Governance: President Biya's long tenure of office (since 1982) and

repression of the opposition.

• Flawed Electoral System:

o Multiple ballot system open to manipulation and voter intimidation.

o Lack of independence and impartiality of the electoral body (ELECAM) and the

Constitutional Council.

o Untimely and non-transparent result announcements.

o Manipulation of the Returning Reports (PVs) from polling station to the Divisional

ELECAM offices.

o Opaque manner of compiling results from the polling stations

o The interdiction of announcing results coming from the polling stations

• Ethno-Political Tensions: Disputes often turn into ethnic divisions between political

camps, fueled by social media misinformation and historical grievances.

• Marginalization & Inequality: Persistent corruption, poor public services, high youth

unemployment, and the ongoing Anglophone conflict contribute to widespread

dissatisfaction.

• Lack of Transition Plan: Failure to prepare for a constitutional transition beyond the

current leadership.

The Theory of Change (ToC) Framework

Title: Our Theory of Change (ToC)

Content:

• **Implement** inclusive reforms, foster genuine dialogue, and ensure accountability...

• Then trust in state institutions will increase, tensions will de-escalate, and grievances will

be addressed through legitimate channels...

• Ultimately leading to a peaceful and stable Cameroon with legitimate, consensual

electoral outcomes and inclusive governance.

Key Pillars of Change:

- 1. Electoral and Constitutional Reform
- 2. Inclusive National Dialogue & Consensus Building
- 3. Justice, Accountability & Confidence Measures
- 4. Socio-Economic Inclusion and Addressing the Anglophone Crisis

Pillar 1: Electoral and Constitutional Reform

Title: Building a Credible Electoral System

Interventions:

- Enhance Independence of ELECAM: Appoint members based on merit and neutrality, not political affiliation, through consultation with all stakeholders.
- **Ensure Transparency:** Implement real-time, transparent result tabulation and publication process.
- **Judicial Reform:** Ensure the Constitutional Council acts as an impartial arbiter of disputes, with transparent procedures and timely implementation of decisions.
- **Prepare for Succession:** Establish a clear and consensual constitutional plan for political transition to avoid a succession crisis.

Pillar 2: Inclusive National Dialogue and Consensus Building

Title: Fostering Genuine Dialogue

Interventions:

- Government-Opposition Dialogue: Initiate dialogue outside of parliament to build consensus on key reforms.
- **Inclusion of All Stakeholders:** Ensure civil society, women, youth, faith leaders, and the diaspora are part of dialogue processes.
- Address Hate Speech: Develop mechanisms with social media companies and media outlets to limit inflammatory content and misinformation, which fuels ethnic tensions.

- Confidence Building Measures: Scale down inflammatory rhetoric and release political detainees and activists to ease tensions ahead of polls.
- Stop provocative and intimidating use of language: Ministers should address the population with respect, instead of intimidating them.

Pillar 3: Justice, Accountability and Confidence Measures

Title: Ensuring Justice and Accountability

Interventions:

- **Investigate Violence:** Launch independent investigations into all reports of killings, arrests, and human rights violations related to post-election violence.
- **Strengthen Rule of Law:** Promote a human rights-based approach to governance and law enforcement.
- **Combat Corruption:** Implement autonomous and performance-based financing mechanisms to increase transparency and tackle systemic corruption.

Pillar 4: Socio-Economic Inclusion and Addressing the Anglophone Crisis

Title: Addressing Root Inequalities

Interventions:

- Address Anglophone Crisis: Engage in serious talks with hardline Anglophone leaders, addressing the root causes of the insurgency and implementing special status with meaningful decentralization.
- **Economic Opportunities:** Provide effective socio-economic alternatives to violence for at-risk groups, particularly youth (high unemployment).
- **Gender Equality:** Promote women's empowerment and participation in political and economic life, which is linked to reduced electoral violence.

Monitoring Progress and Key Assumptions

Title: Monitoring Progress and Key Assumptions

Monitoring Indicators:

• Passage of key electoral reform legislation.

• Number of political prisoners released and dialogue initiatives successfully held.

• Reduced incidents of post-electoral violence and hate speech.

• Increased voter turnout and trust in the process.

Key Assumptions:

• The government has the political will to engage in genuine reform.

• The opposition will participate constructively in dialogue and refrain from violence.

• International partners will consistently support and pressure for reform.

• Civil society and media can operate freely and safely.

Conclusion and Call to Action

Title: Conclusion and The Way Forward

Content:

• Resolving Cameroon's post-electoral crisis requires a holistic approach addressing

political, social, and economic root causes.

• The proposed Theory of Change provides a roadmap for sustainable peace through

concrete interventions.

• Call to Action: Urge all national political and social actors, supported by international

partners (UN, EU, AU), to act swiftly and decisively to implement these reforms to prevent

further instability and ensure a peaceful future.
